

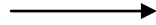

Seed B: Canola



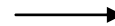
Canola is grown by farmers throughout [Canada](#), particularly in the Prairies. It is a Canadian variety of the rapeseed plant.

Seed C: Soybean



Soybean is a major cash crop in much of Latin America, where it is often being grown for export to North America and Europe for feeding livestock and to fuel cars as biofuels. Soybean plantations can come at the cost of deforestation, eviction of small-scale farmers, and erosion of agricultural biodiversity. 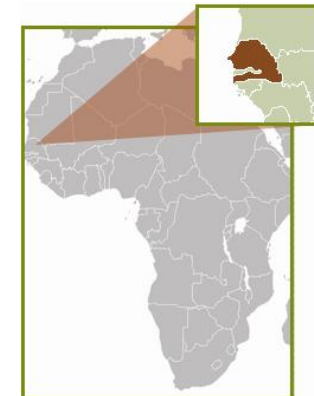
